## Lancashire Chamber Orchestra – News Release Young percussion star joins matinee chamber concert

Rising percussion star Max Heaton makes his debut with the Lancashire Chamber Orchestra at a classical music matinee concert in Altrincham on Sunday 20<sup>th</sup> March.

Seventeen-year-old Max, who has performed with the National Youth Orchestra, National Children's Orchestra and the Halle Youth Orchestra, takes centre stage for a solo role in Ney Rosauro's stunning Concerto for Marimba and String Orchestra.

Widely acknowledged as the most popular marimba concerto in the orchestral repertoire, it was written in 1986, premiered in Brasilia and has since been performed by more than 800 orchestras across the world, including Evelyn Glennie and the London Symphony Orchestra. Unusually it contains four movements including a vigorous, rhythmic finale, promising Altrincham audiences an exhilarating end to the first half of the concert.

Conductor Alex Robinson, a music student at the University of Manchester, and also a rising star of the classical music world, makes a welcome return to the Lancashire Chamber Orchestra for this concert.

Under his baton, the orchestra will perform a contrasting programme which begins with a suite from the 18<sup>th</sup> century ballet 'Les Indes Galantes' by French composer
