Ice Queen brings panto cool to Kingsley

Kingsley Players will be transforming the village community centre into a palace of ice for their traditional January panto.

The theatre group is staging the '*The Ice Queen and the Enchanted Mirror*', another magical pantomime written by Norley's talented musician and playwright William Arnold Ashbrook.

Punk blackbirds, a chorus of slaves and an Ice Queen with a frozen heart will be casting the traditional panto spell at Kingsley Community Centre on Wednesday 22nd – Saturday 25th January at 7.30pm. There will also be a Saturday matinee starting at 2.30pm.

Director Mary Lightfoot explained: "We have a fantastic cast of more than 30 adults, teenagers and children, superb costumes, catchy songs and great dance routines.

"It is a traditional panto-style story about an ice queen who has a heart of ice and rules her kingdom with a rod of iron. On seeing her reflection in a witch's mirror, she is duped into thinking she's a great beauty. The mirror shatters into a million pieces which spread far and wide. A piece lands in the eye of a young boy Tom and, as the sages foretell, anyone who catches a shard in his eye will be compelled to kill the Ice Queen.

"It's a heart-warming tale guaranteed to dispel the worst chills of January," she said.
